POST 16 OPTIONS DEFINITIONS

Column A		Column B
Studying Further Education		These are courses studied at universities, university colleges and higher education institutions. They last for at least 3 years and you specialize in a subject.
Apprenticeship		Studying at school or college after 16. Course from entry level to level 4.
Traineeship		Time in college and a workplace to develop the skills needed for the workplace. Support from a job coach. For people with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP).
Higher Education		Get skills or experience for an apprenticeship or job. For people who want to get an apprenticeship or job, but don't yet have the skills/experience needed.
Supported Employment		Work + Pay + Study. There are different levels depending on your experience and qualifications.
Supported Internship		Support from a job coach to learn and keep a job. This can help develop job skills, to look for paid or voluntary work, and overcome barriers to employment.
